Birthday money bird

If you have a Birthday party and a last minute crisis what to give them, or if you're going to give money, but want to do something special with it: this is a very quick and easy idea. Print out the bird on cardstock paper and follow these six steps to make your Birthday money bird gift.



You will need:

1. The printed template (pick the bird that will fit in the jar)

- 2. An empty jar
- 3. Fishing string
- 4. Sticky tape
- 5. Scissors
- 6. Paper knife
- 7. A pin pusher
- 8. Cardstock paper
- 9. Birthday money
- 10. Gift bow
- Step 1: Cut out the bird, pierce the tiny hole at the top, then cut out the eye and the rectangle.
- Step 2: Fold the money you are going to give and place it inside the rectangle (it should be the same width as the rectangle inside the bird). Fold it open a little bit on both sides, so it won't shift around.
- Step 3: Find an empty jar and pierce a hole in the lid.
- Step 4: Attach the bird to some fishing string and pull it through the hole in the lid. Measure how long the fishing string needs to be, cut off the excess string, then add some sticky tape on the lid to secure it.
- **Step 5:** Drop the birds into the jar and close the lid.
- Step 6: Put a gift bow on top of the lid and you're done!
