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Baby crinkle blankie

Making baby shower gifts is very addictive. This blankie is something I had on my list for a while now. I already had all the materials, I just needed to begin. So last night I did and I'm pleased with the outcome. A very cute and crinkly blankie. Today I've written a tutorial, so you might make one yourself. Just follow the instructions and pictures. You don't have to be an expert to make this!



You will need:

- 1. The printed template
- 2. Soft fabric for the back
- 3. Pattern fabric for the front
- 4. Thread in a matching color
- 5. Sewing pins
- 6. (Fabric) scissors
- 7. Crinkle paper
- 8. Sewing machine
- 9. Ribbon in matching colors
- 10. Ruler or sewing tape measure
- 11. The pictures in this tutorial
- Step 1: Cut out the paper template. Place it on top of a piece of fabric and cut along the edges.
- Step 2: Cut enough ribbon to go around your fabric. I cut five different colors 4 times. All pieces are about 8 cm long.
- Step 3: Fold the ribbons in half and divide them along the edges of the fabric.

 Make sure they point inside. Fasten them with sewing pins and sew them to the fabric using your sewing machine.

 (TIP: place the pins along the length of the ribbon, so you can sew over them)
- Step 4: Cut out the back piece of fabric and the crinkle paper using the template again for size.
- Step 5: Sew the crinkle paper to the back piece of fabric. That way it won't shift when you sew your blankie pieces together.
- Step 6: Place the back piece of fabric on top of the front piece. Make sure the crinkle paper is on top. Leave an opening to turn the blankie inside out!
- Step 7: Cut the corners a little, so they won't be in the way. Now you can turn your blankie inside out. The ribbons actually help you turn your blankie inside out, because you can pull them a little. Make sure the corners are pushed back as far as possible.
- Step 8: Fold the ends of the opening back inside and secure it with pins. Now you can sew your entire blankie all the way round. Not only does that



close the opening, but it also secures the ribbon some more. We don't want baby to be able to pull them out while playing with their blankie. And that's it!
