Window drawing instructions

You want this pattern on your window and you don't know how to start? Follow these instructions and soon you can admire your own work!

You will need:

1. This template
2. Chalkboard window marker
3. Sticky tape
4. Paper
5. Printer

Step 1: You've already done that by opening this file 😊.

Step 2: Click on the print option or press Ctrl+p.

Step 3: If you want the pattern to be on A4 you can just go ahead and print the desired page. If you would like a bigger pattern, you should be able to find 'poster' within the printing menu. There you can choose how big you want it to be, simply by changing the scale from 100% to whatever you like (make sure to enter which page you want to print, otherwise it will print every single page in this document as a poster). For instance:

- If you want it on two A4 sheets, choose 135%.
- If you want it on four A4 sheets, choose 190%.
- If you want it on six A4 sheets, choose 205%.
- If you want it on eight A4 sheets, choose 270%, etc.

Step 4: Once it is printed, use the sticky tape to tape the sheets together.

Step 5: Go to the window where you want to draw the pattern and use sticky tape to attach it to the back of the window.

Step 6: Use the chalkboard window marker to go over the outline of the pattern. I usually close one eye, because with double glazing it is hard to see the line. Mistakes are easily corrected with a damp cloth, followed by a dry cloth.

Step 7: Once completed remove the template and admire your work. Enjoy!
